

Log Cabin Quilt Block

What you need

- 7 x different 100% cotton fabrics, using prints, solids, or a combination of both. If using fabric off a bolt you will need:

- (A) Centre square - 10cm
- (B) First group of pieces - 10cm
- (C) Second group of pieces - 10cm
- (D) Third group of pieces - 10cm
- (E) Fourth group of pieces - 10cm
- (F) Fifth group of pieces - 10cm
- (G) Sixth group of pieces - 10cm

- Rotary Cutter & Cutting Mat
- Ruler
- Sewing Machine
- Iron

Tips before you start

- Pre-wash and press your fabric before you start to avoid shrinkage. Follow the care instructions for your chosen fabric.
- Press using a pressing cloth to prevent damaging your fabric. Test your iron settings on a scrap piece of fabric before you start your project.

Instructions

Step 1: Cut the Pieces

Fabric (A) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 2 ½".

Fabric (B) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 2 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 4 ½".

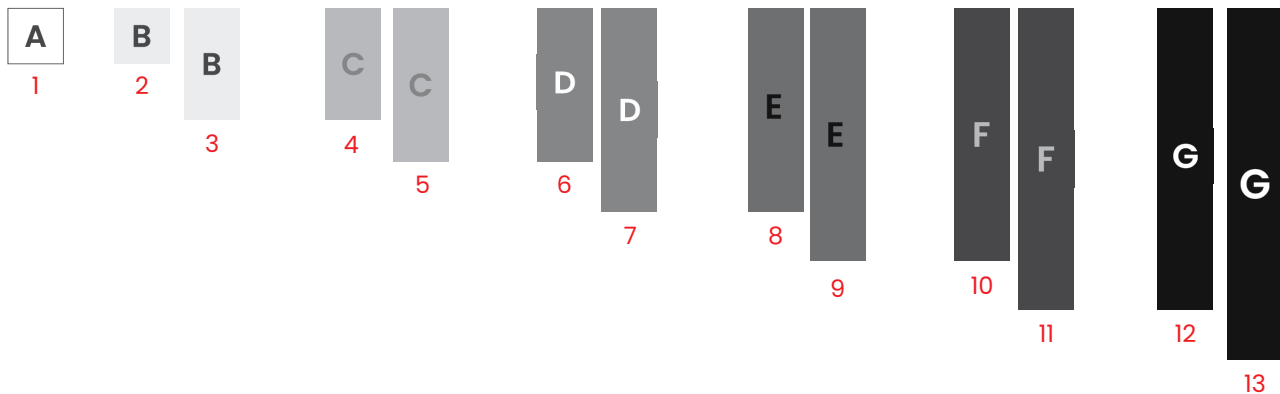
Fabric (C) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 4 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 6 ½".

Fabric (D) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 6 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 8 ½".

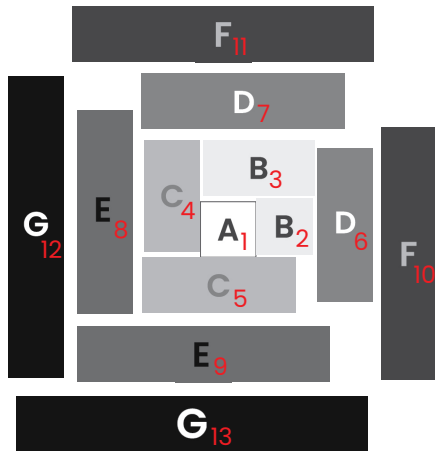
Fabric (E) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 8 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 10 ½".

Fabric (F) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 10 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 12 ½".

Fabric (G) Cut one piece of 2 ½" x 12 ½" and one piece of 2 ½" x 14 ½".



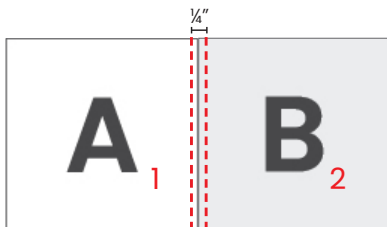
Step 2: Place the fabric pieces following the diagram below:



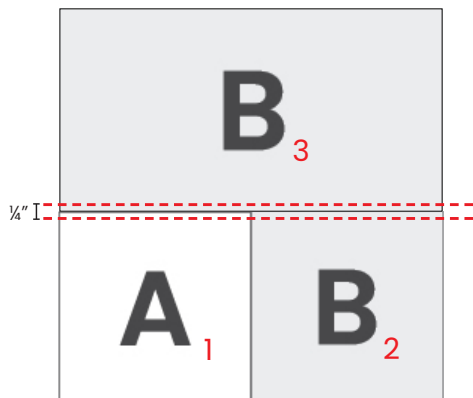
Placement preview

Step 3: Stitch the first two squares

Stitch Fabric (A) to Fabric (B) squares together using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and press flat.

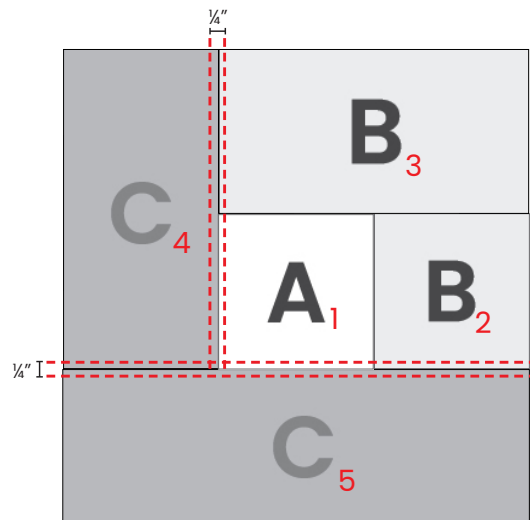


Add the second Fabric (B) piece.

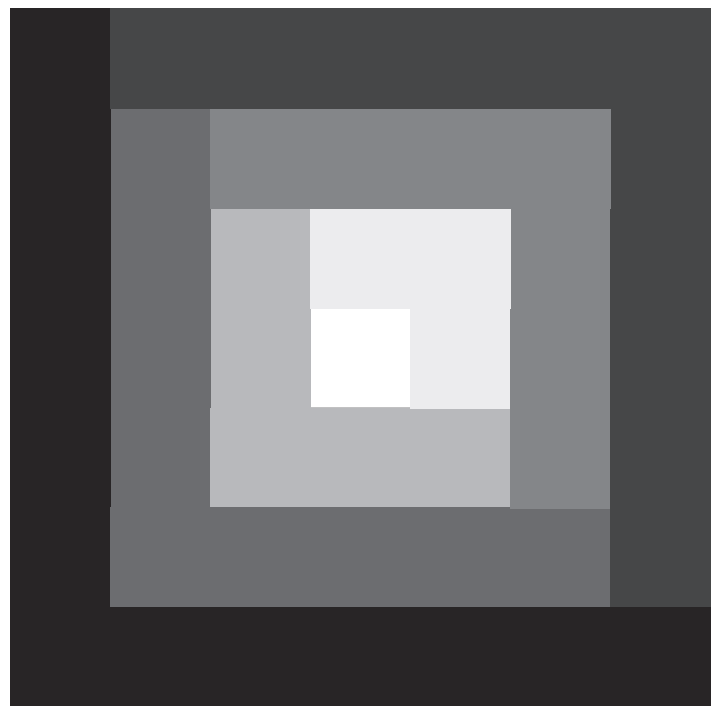


Step 4: Continue the spiral

Continue working counter clockwise, adding one piece at a time until all pieces have been added.



Trim the block to $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".
