March. 2020 Hungry Bunny Wreath

Materials




- 1.2m orange fabric
- 1m green fabric
- 1lb of poly fill
- 0.3m of chenille
- 1 faux fur pom pom
- 0.2m craft heavyweight fusing
- 18" metal wreath
- needle & thread
- glue gun


Sewing Info

• Seam allowance is 1/4" unless otherwise stated.





1. Using the pattern provided cut out 40 carrot pieces, to make 20 carrots, and 80 leaf pieces, to make 80 leaves.




2. Place your carrot pieces right sides together and stitch along the side, pivoting at the point and stitching up the other side. Leave the top of the carrot open to turn right side out.



3. Trim the bottom of the carrot and the sides.



5. Stuff your carrots with poly fill and set aside.



4. Turn the carrot right side out.



6. Place your leaves right sides together and stitch around the leaves. Leave the bottom open to turn right side out.






7. Trim and snip the curves. Turn right side out.



8. Tie a knot at the end of your thread and hand stitch a gathering stitch to the top of the carrot. Pull tight to close the carrot. Stitch the edge closed and secure with a knot.



9. Tie a knot at the end of your thread and hand stitch a gathering stitch to the opening of the leaf, stitching through both layers. Attach to the top of the carrot. Repeat with the second leaf.



10. Using the pattern provided cut out 2 bunnies from the chenille. Place wrong sides together and stitch around leaving a 3" opening at the bottom.



11 Trim the seam allowance from the pattern and use it to cut out the craft fusing. Trim the craft fusing to fit the bunny. Stuff the craft fusing into the opening. Stitch the opening closed.



12. Using hot glue, glue the faux fur pom pom onto the bunny.



13. Glue the bunny onto the metal wreath frame. Glue the carrots onto the frame, alternating between small and large.
